15TH FOLKESTONE ROTARY HALF MARATHON – Challenging weather

and requirements do not stop runners having a good time.

Forward comment from Race Director Ray Johnson:

"Today's race was challenging with constant rain and strong winds and in addition to the many requirements for runners due to the Covid-19 situation with distancing rules and other requirements which did not stop or deter runners from having a good time. Many participants have already been in contact to thank the club and helpers for providing a much-needed race to the area.

A restricted sold out field of over 300 runners lined up on the famous Folkestone Leas promenade on Sunday for the start of the popular 15th half marathon.

Runners set off in waves of 12 for distancing requirements after a temperature check to comply with the new Covid-19 rules set by UK Athletics. We were not permitted to hand out our medals and trophies, but these will be despatched in the post.

I was pleased to see a few newcomers at 17 years old to one runner at 81 some who came as far as Cambridge and Oxford.

Congratulations to all those who participated. This year's winner Anthony Johnson of Kent AC at 1:08:24 just 24seconds out of the course record and similarly the ladies' winner was Georgina Wiley achieved a commendable 1:24:17 also from Kent AC. My heartiest congratulations to both runners who clearly pushed incredibly hard.

The male team prizes went to Kent AC and female team to Maidstone Harriers. Many clubs participated and runners were most pleased to return once again to a competitive environment in addition there were many teams and many participating for charities. Everyone seemed in high spirits"

Club president Terry Cooke-Davis commented: "It is a fantastic achievement for the runners to complete the course either as an elite runner or a new participant to a half marathon – 13.1 miles no mean feat. The objectives of the race are to encourage participation, assist charities, visit our district and promote good health, as well as increase the profile of sport and I am particularly delighted that there was such a good turnout during these challenging times. Thanks to you all that have made the event such a success once again.

This year we support The Folkestone Youth Project and we are aware they are in need of funds and this event will assist them greatly"

Ray Johnson continues: "The event went extremely well, and help was received with sincere thanks from over 60 marshals and assistants including Hythe, Channel & Folkestone Rotary Clubs, Nice Work and many local support volunteers. I would also like to thank our many sponsors and Folkestone & Hythe District Council for their valuable support.

Once again, we have received tremendous feedback from the runners congratulating us for such a great event, by way of organisation, encouragement from marshals and most importantly holding the event safely. They also thoroughly enjoyed the course and the seafront areas.


